

## **OVERLAKE DRESS STANDARDS**

Overlake's dress standards are a reflection of the Club's traditions and values as a long-standing private club in Medina. Members are responsible for assuring that their families and guests are aware of these standards and abide by them.

### **General Restrictions**

- No blue jeans or blue jean skirts on any golf facilities
- No cargo pants or cargo shorts on any golf facilities
- No workout attire
- No sweatshirts
- No T-shirts
- No unkempt, dirty or tattered clothing
- No swimwear in the clubhouse. When in transit, a cover-up must be worn.
- No shoes with metal spikes
- No hats or visors in the indoor dining areas

### **Required for All**

- "Golf Attire" is acceptable in the Clubhouse
- Shirts designed to be tucked in must be tucked in
- Hats and visors are to be worn with the bill forward
- Jeans must be free of frayed ends, holes, tears
- Racquet attire is allowed on the decks and patios

### **"Golf Attire" for Men**

- Collared shirts with sleeves
- Slacks and shorts must have a zipper

### **"Golf Attire" for Women**

- Shirts with a collar and/or sleeves

### **Children**

- Children are to follow the same dress standards as adults
- Children (elementary school age) are allowed to wear their clean team uniforms inside the clubhouse

### **Dress Standards Notes**

- The Pro Shop and General Manager will enforce the dress standards on behalf of the Board of Trustees and the membership
- Please be sure that your guests are aware of our dress standards, which are posted on the website for your convenience
- Exceptions for special events will be noted on event announcements
- When visiting or playing at another facility, remember to check their dress standards

### **Enforcement**

- Members or guests who are out of compliance will not allowed to use the golf facilities.
- If a member or their guest is out of compliance in the clubhouse, they will be seated and served. However, the General Manager will send the member an email dress standards reminder. If there are more than two infractions by a member, the matter will be sent to the club's Disciplinary Committee.
